MCB majors seeking a discipline-specific study abroad experience should consider the LAS-MCB in Vienna program.

- Location**
- The Austria-Illinois Exchange program has been in place for over 25 years, and comes with a high level of support from Illinois faculty and staff in Vienna alike.
- Timing**
- 1 semester program, offered in the fall term (September-December)
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> year program (intended for the 3<sup>rd</sup> year, but 4<sup>th</sup> may be possible)
- Eligibility**
- This program is designed for MCB majors who have completed the MCB Core prior to departure: MCB 150, MCB 250/251, MCB 252/253. MCB 354 is preferred, but not required. If MCB 354 has not been taken, the course selection will accommodate the lack of biochemistry.
  - Academically rigorous (GPA of 3.00+), course approval and articulation guaranteed.
- Courses**
- One introductory German language course (GER 101) and one cultural & history course (GER 420) are both required. The remaining courses taken will be Advanced MCB courses.
  - Research experiences are available.
  - There is an on-site program director to assist students with questions and program-based concerns. They also provide an extensive, multi-week orientation.
- Housing**
- Participants live in well-situated dormitories with a mix of Austrian and other foreign students. Single- and double- occupancy housing is available.
- Deadline**
- Apply early to ensure that you get a slot. The application's absolute deadline is 15 February for the following fall semester.

All courses pre-approved for this program are guaranteed to transfer back to Illinois, count toward your degree program, and count toward residency credit.
